

School Trips

School Tour - The whole school went on the 2022 school tour on May 24th to Let's Go! at the GAA Centre of Excellence.

The children had a fantastic day and participated in a really wide range of activities including KMX Karts, a disco dome, an assault course, relays, athletics, team challenges, bouncy castle, Zorbee ball and a climbing wall. Maria stood out as the star of the day with her exceptional climbing skills – she scaled the full height of the wall and made it look effortless – well done Maria!





Sports Day - We went to the Tom Ruane Park in Ballina for our 2022 Sports Day on Friday June 3rd.

There was a good balance between non-competitive and competitive events to ensure that all children were included. The emphasis on the day was on four of the Olympic Values – Friendship, Respect, Determination and Excellence. Teams were awarded points as they made their way around the different stations. The day finished with a series of 200m races that children could choose to participate in. We were really lucky with the weather, it was beautiful all day. Staff and children alike had a fantastic experience.

Sixth Class Overnight Trip - Caroline & Elaine organised the first ever Newtownwhite overnight excursion in June.

Sixth class were treated to this special trip to mark their graduation from the school as the first ever group of children to attend an Educate Together national school from Junior Infants all the way up to Sixth Class in Co. Mayo. The group went to Galway, cooked a BBQ, made themselves a fry for breakfast and finished the experience with a trip to Pure Skill in Galway. The children did themselves proud and truly had an experience they will always remember.





School Improvements

As well as our lovely new logo there have been a number of other school improvements this term.

There has been investment in technology this term which will benefit all classes.

The Middle Room have received a brand new MiTouch Interactive Flat Screen and all rooms have received new class laptops for use by classroom teachers. Added to the tablets and Chromebooks the children already use these new additions allow us to continue to offer children the most up to date technological resources we can.

We now have our new logo displayed over the front door on a brand new school sign.

Finally, we have installed a new CCTV system around the school grounds. We hope that this will add to the safety and security of the school grounds and equipment for children and for staff.

Wellbeing Updates

We have continued Wellbeing Wednesdays throughout the term as well as a number of other activities.

Tennis

We teamed up with Ballina Tennis Club in May to provide a course of four lessons for all children at a minimal cost to parents & guardians. The lessons were a huge success and gave children a chance to experience tennis in a beautiful environment with the fantastic coach Artur . All children really progressed over the four weeks.

Swimming

Swimming lessons finished just after Spring Break and they were a huge success with the children. We look forward to offering them again next year.

Stay Safe

The Stay Safe Programme was delivered in all rooms during the term. The Stay Safe programme is developmentally tailored and contains four sets of lessons suitable for Infants, First and Second classes, Third and Fourth classes, and Fifth and Sixth classes. The lessons plans are divided into the five Stay Safe Topics: Feeling Safe and Unsafe; Friendship and Bullying; Touches; Secrets and Telling; Strangers.

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GAA

We have officially launched our Newtownwhite GAA team this term! Managed by Sarah and co-managed by Diarmuid the team consists of 13 of our students ranging from 2nd – 6th class. Michael Fitzmaurice (Captain of the 1985 winning Mayo minor team) visited the school for training sessions each week in May. Peter McDonnell and Killala FC have also kindly allowed us to use their astro pitch for training sessions during the term.

The team took part in the Cumann na mBunscol 'Small Schools Blitz' on May 31st at the GAA Centre of Excellence in Bekan. The players also sat a GAA exam in school on Friday 3rd June and the results were fantastic. They are now ready to participate in Division 4 of Cumann na mBunscol in 2022/2023 and we look forward to seeing them progress.

Michael from CyberSafeKids led workshops in the Senior and Middle Rooms as well as an evening session with parents on June 14th. The sessions offer a general overview to raise awareness of the main factors to consider around social media, gaming and the online world.



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Killala Coast Guard Visit

Shaunna and Alex from the Killala Coast Guard Unit kindly visited our school on Monday June 20th. As the end of the school year is drawing closer and the weather is improving there is an increase in the amount of people getting involved in water based activities. The Coast Guard Unit is visiting schools in the local area to create a better awareness among young people of safety procedures in or around the water and also to educate on what to do if you see someone in danger.

The information session was really invaluable. The children were fascinated by all of the equipment and gear and were allowed to try things on and see how everything worked. They loved seeing the Coast Guard vehicle drive into the yard.

Play Therapy

Planting and growing continues in the school grounds and we hope to be able to harvest some potatoes this year.

Staff Development

Staff have undertaken training in a number of different areas during Term 3.

Caroline and Kate attended the PDST **Primary Wellbeing** seminar in May. This full day, face-to-face seminar explored the sensitive elements of RSE within the context and structure of a whole school approach to SPHE, from Junior Infants to 6th Class. Caroline attended **Misneach** leadership training in May also. Misneach provides newly appointed principals with support and guidance in their roles. Kate undertook the **Google Certified Trainer Programme** with Canopy Education which included six weeks training and exams covering all Google tools in order to demonstrate an array of skills in using Google in the Classroom.

Ciara completed Level 1 **Six Bricks** training with Miriam O'Donoghue which will be rolled out in the Junior Room in September. Six Bricks uses a set of six LEGO® DUPLO® bricks to create activities that are short, simple exercises designed to wake up the brain and get a child moving, thinking and remembering.

The whole staff participated in PDST training in June to support the implementation of the new **Primary Language Curriculum** which covers both English and Gaeilge. This training supports teachers in delivering the curriculum across all class levels.
